*Fire Department Culture and Operations*

*Psychological First Aid*

*National Incident Management System (NIMS) 100,200,700,800*

*Critical Incident Stress Management (CISM) Group, Individual and Grief*

*Following Trauma*

*CPR and First Aid*

Ongoing training is expected and available through organizations such as the Federation of Fire Chaplains (FFC), the Illinois Corps of Fire Chaplains (ICFC) and MABAS. This makes MABAS chaplains uniquely suited to meet additional needs that are beyond the general scope of what other first responders are able to provide.

- to develop a network designed to assist victims of fires, disasters and terrorism.

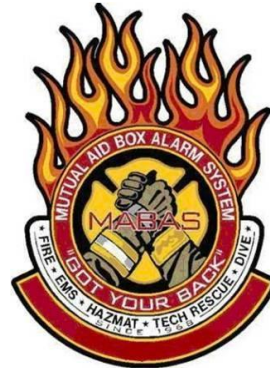
In partnership with MABAS we are reaching across the state of Illinois to provide an effective network of mutual aid, training and a standard of care in our departments and communities.
